E-safety

Our school internet has rigorous systems in place for managing the children's internet use and keeping them safe online. This does not translate at home so it is important that you have your own restrictions in place.

If a device is not connected at home then it is safer but if you connect it to your home WiFi then you need to ensure your own firewalls, and filters are in place. Our school safety systems involve rigorous monitoring by all staff and training the children in staying safe online and knowing how to respond if they see something that makes them feel uncharitable.





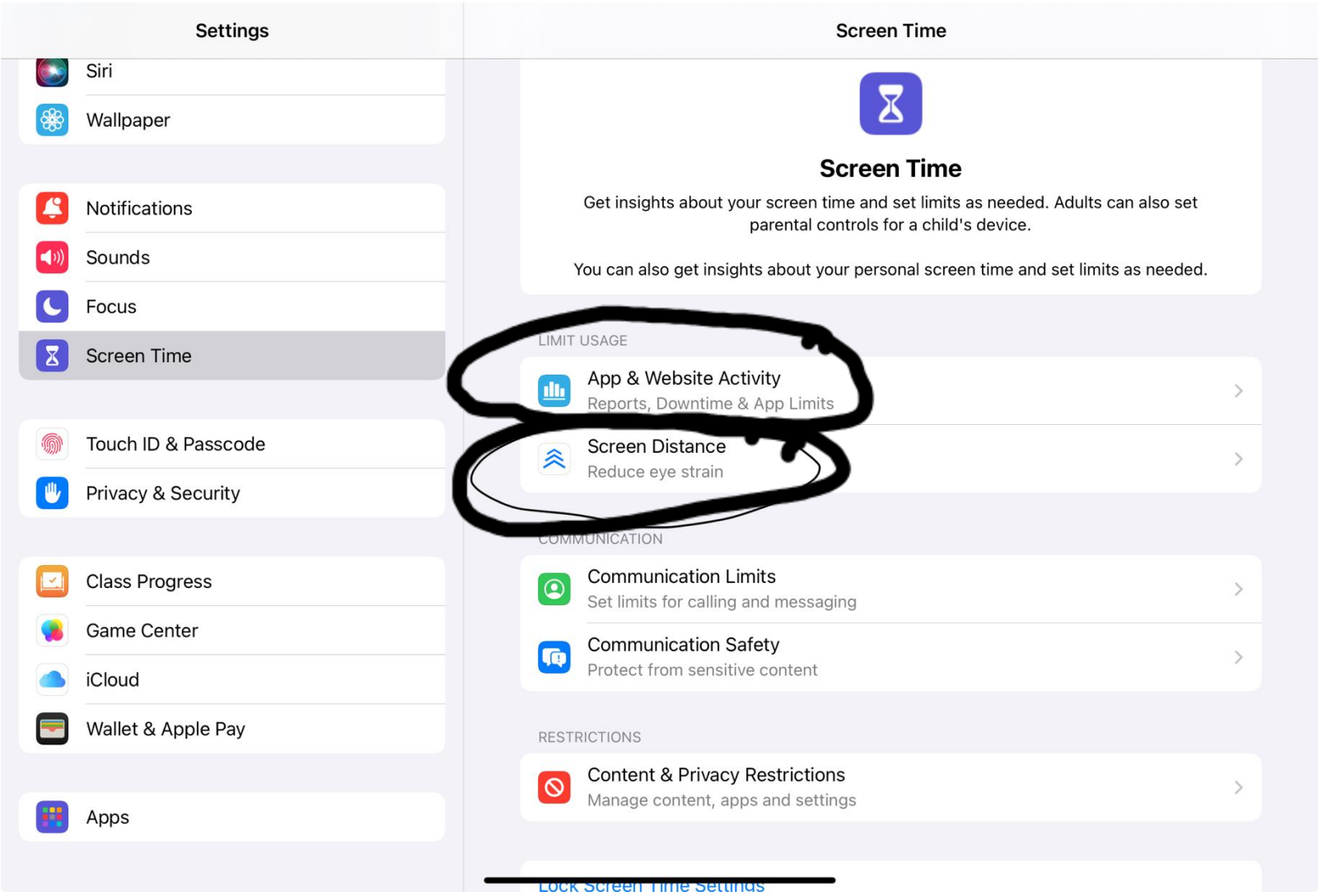
E-safety continued

Key takeaways

It is a learning tool first and foremost.

Top Tips

Regularly check children's camera roll and delete any images that are not necessary.

Build a routine with charging - we expect iPads to be fully charged each day.

Clear the safari tabs so that the processing isn't slow.

Don't buy headphones or a stylus; school will provide these.

Clear the background apps.

Keep login and passwords safely stored and easy to access. Take a photo on your phone/device!

Check software updates from time to time.
