





Year 5/6

Easter Eggs in the Garden



Along with three other Red Kite schools we have been working with RHS Garden Harlow Carr to decorate some giant Easter eggs which are on display from 23 March – 7 April as part of their Easter event. Families visiting the garden will get the chance to vote for their favourite egg, with the school with the most votes receiving some gardening equipment. If you're visiting Harlow Carr over Easter please vote for us as we would love some more kit for our school! Our Reception children and the children in the HIVE have been working hard on making ours particularly beautiful!

Every child taking part in the egg hunt will also get a delicious chocolatey treat from NOMO, which is dairy, gluten, nut and egg free so suitable for everyone.

Usual garden admissions apply for families visiting the garden; however, they currently have two promotions which offer reduced price entry to the garden.

Travel by bus to the garden:

The Harrogate Bus Company runs regular buses from Harrogate Bus Station in the town centre to RHS Garden Harlow Carr, reaching the garden in 15 minutes. Catch buses from the pick-up called 'Harlow Grange' on Otley Road, a short 4-minute walk to the garden entrance.

Fares are £2 maximum (single fare guaranteed) until the end of 2024 and visitors who travel by bus receive a discount of 30% on garden admission.

Visit the garden for £1:

Firstly, we hope all of our wonderful Western community has a wonderful Easter break!




When we come back, we're heading guite guickly into the Years 1&2 Party.

EYFS

Early Years have worked very well this half term initially showing creativity in dance when creating dance patterns using animal movements. They then showed amazing respect when following instructions and turn taking, whilst working together exploring ball games.

Year 2 have worked hard exploring and performing dances and gymnastics using simple movement patterns. They have developed their movements in cannon and unison as well as developing short routines and dances. In particular, they have shown respect and strong communication when providing feedback to each other on how they can develop and improve.

KS2

Handball and OAA have been the focus of this term for Year 3/4. Students have shown great understanding of team sports showing their transferable skills from football into handball. They have then shown a commitment to teamwork when taking part in teambuilding OAA activities. It has developed their understanding of the wider benefits of PE for example communication and encouragement. Year 5/6 have started to develop their strategy and tactics. They have focused on Hockey and Netball and how skills and tactics can be transferred between sports. Fantastic work by all children and staff!

- Schools PE sossions. Bring your whole class for regular PE sessions.
 Maybe funded by your PE and Sports Premium. Climbing is now an
 Olympic sport so encourage that budding athlete. It is also good for
 those who aren't sporty because it is just you and the wall to build
 confidence. Book either a one-off session or a block.
- School trips. Why not come to Clip 'n Climb likley for your school trip this year? We can provide a picnic lunch for an extra cost, if required, Make a day of it and go on likley Moor afterwards. We are located on the train/bus station (plus free car park) so we are easily accessible.
- SENDs groups. You may have a group of children you want to do something extra with. We welcome children with special educational needs (SENDs) regularly and our staff are good at interacting with children of all physical and emotional abilities.
- Reward. Some schools have brought groups of children as a reward for something, e.g. best academic improvement, most improved behaviour or best attendance.
- Staff team building. If you need somewhere to come away from school for staff team building, then try something different (min 10 climbers).
- Wellbeing initiative. Experience the mental and physical benefits of climbing for staff and for students (min 10 climbers).
- PTA fund raiser or PTA meetings. Ask your PTA to try something new.
 With enough climbers we could help with your PTA fundraising. Or have your PTA meeting here whilst the children of the PTA committee climb.
- Staff or parents' nights out. Have a staff night out here. With a group of 10 or more try something fun before your meal or drinks in likley. We can provide food/nibbles, on request.
